History

On January 5, 2020, I stood before you as your new pastor and said that 2020 was a new decade, and a new beginning for FPC; that there was excitement in the air as we began a new era. But I also noted that new beginnings also come with some uncertainty. Okay, that was the understatement of the year! Who knew what was going to happen in 2020 – God knew.

This month FPC celebrates 125 years of ministry in the greater Punta Gorda area. That is a true testament to God's faithfulness. It is also a testament to the leaders and members of FPC that God has brought to this congregation. As on January 5th, I am reminded again this month of Hebrews 13:7-8, which reads: Remember your leaders, those who spoke to you the word of God. Consider the outcome of their way of life, and imitate their faith. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.

As a history buff, I enjoyed reading the history of FPC. The pictures of previous church buildings; the men and women who gave sacrificially of their time, talent, and treasure to establish this congregation; the natural disasters that this congregation fought through; the switching of denominations as FPC stayed true to the Scriptures; the thirty-six ministers who answered God's call and served this congregation; the elders and deacons that served faithfully; the all new challenges that FPC faced this year with Covid-19; and God's providential hand over all 125 years of ministry.

This is a great month to stop and celebrate what God has done in this place. He has given FPC leaders that remained true to His Word, and their way of life was worthy of imitating. As I look at the jar of dirt in my office -taken from the first building site of the church-we celebrate the past, but we also look to the future. God is not finished with FPC in the greater Punta Gorda area. This has been a different kind of year to say the least. Yet, we have been able to continue ministry and stay connected through it all, however different it may have looked. The year 2020 turned out to be a different kind of new beginning — a blank slate as it were — for our congregation to figure out how to do ministry in this new normal — for today and for tomorrow.

As we look to the future, I remember the past – God's faithfulness. But I also look out over our congregation and see the gifts of our people and dream about ministry in the coming years – God's future grace to FPC. John Piper talked about looking at the future grace of God, because we can look back at His faithfulness in the past. That is not being presumptuous of God, after all in His Word He has told us - Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.

To God be the glory in this place!!

And I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year: "Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown." And he replied: "Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the Hand of God. That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way.



FPC'S Church History Highlights 1895 - 2020

October 13, 1895	13, 1895 The Presbytery of South Florida of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America organizes this Church.				
July 16, 1898	Reverend Clarence H. Ferran became the first full-time minister.				
April 1901	The first Church building was completed on Harvey Street for \$5,000.				
June 1912	The first manse was built across the street from the Church.				
March 30, 1924	The Church becomes self-supporting after thirty years of financial support fr the Board of Missions of the PCUSA.				
May 6, 1956	The New Sunday School wing was dedicated.				
September 10, 1960	Hurricane Donna extensively damages the Church with the bell tower collapsing onto the roof of the sanctuary.				
October 1961	The last service held in the old, damaged Church.				
March 4, 1962	The new Church, rebuilt on the same location for \$70,000, was dedicated.				
March 1975	Re-construction of the Fellowship Hall and redesign of the kitchen began.				
December 1981	The largest Congregation in the Church's history recorded at 277 members.				
December 30, 1984	Reverend Reese Y. Henderson—the longest serving Pastor of the Church—retired at age 70 after serving 25 years.				
October 13, 1995	The Church's Centennial Celebration was held.				
1996	A new Steeple Tower and Cross including hallway extensions into the Narthex and Fellowship Hall were completed.				
October 31, 2001	The Church votes to become a "Confessing Church".				
July 1, 2003	Reverend Stephen Mock was called as Pastor—soon to lead his flock through terrible disaster.				
August 13, 2004	Hurricane Charley destroys the sanctuary and heavily damages the rest of the Church building in downtown Punta Gorda.				
April 2, 2006	The newly remodeled building on Airport Road is dedicated to the Glory of God.				
January 20, 2013	The Congregation requests dismissal from the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) denomination to join the Covenant Order of Evangelical Presbyterians denomination (ECO).				
February 28, 2013	Peace River Presbytery of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) dismisses the Congregation as requested.				
September 29, 2013	The Congregation votes to accept a four-year lease on the Church building from Peace River Presbytery (PC-USA) for \$1/year.				
September 29, 2017	First Presbyterian Church purchases the Church building from Peace River Presbytery (PC-USA).				
December 31, 2019	Pastor Stephen Mock retired at age 66 after serving 16 years.
